## Today and Tomorrow's Weather

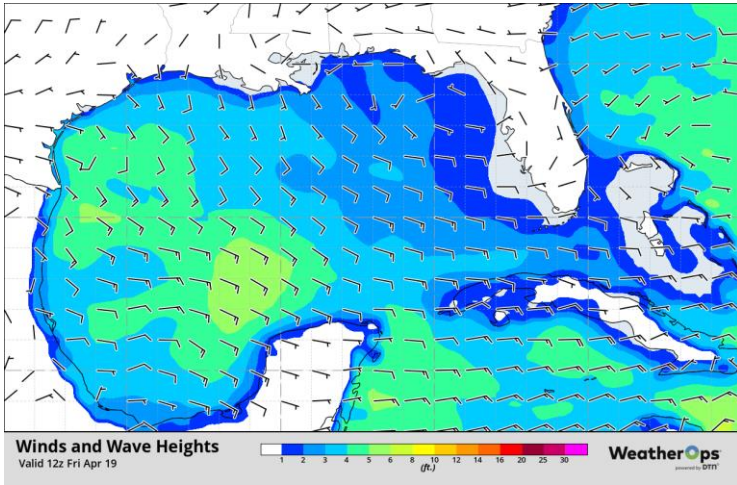
Today, mostly dry conditions are expected along with gentle to moderate winds with slight to moderate seas. Mostly dry conditions are expected throughout the day on Saturday then a potential frontal boundary will impact the northern basin sometime late overnight Saturday into early Sunday morning, bringing an elevated risk for thunderstorms to offshore regions in the northern gulf. Winds will gradually shift to being out of the north, with gusts to 30 knots possible along with moderate seas.

## Day Three through Seven Weather Hazards

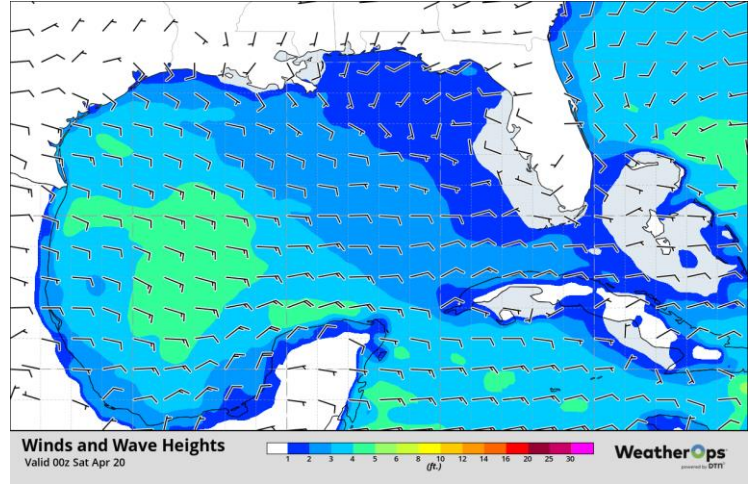
The frontal boundary will depart the region by early next week leaving mostly dry conditions across the region, however a few isolated showers and storms will be possible across the western Gulf. Winds will gradually shift to being out of the north, with gusts to 30 knots possible along with moderate seas. Drier conditions are expected to return across the region by mid-week next week and will persist through the end of the week. Some isolated showers and storms may be possible at times along with locally enhanced winds and seas, but no hazards are expected.



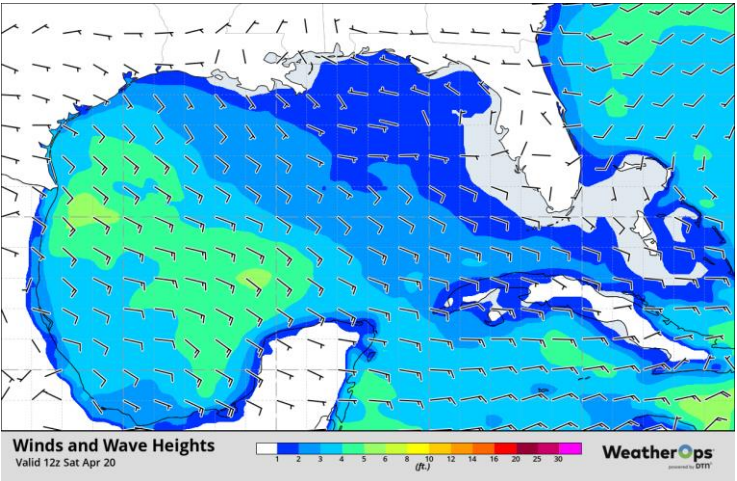
## This Morning's Winds and Seas



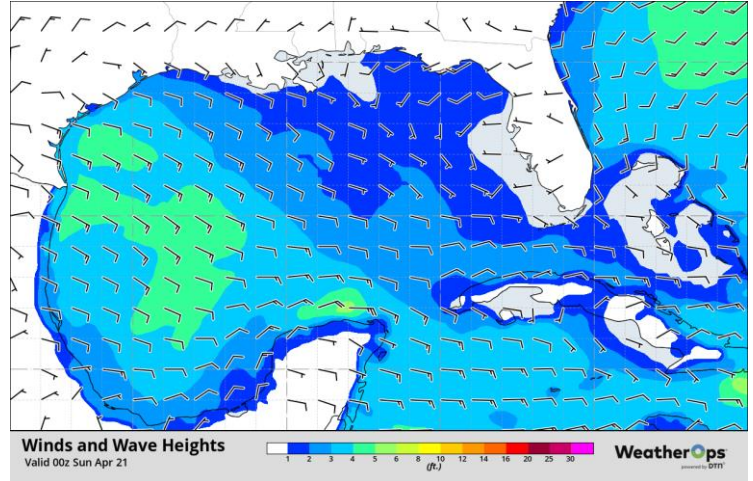
## This Evening's Winds and Seas



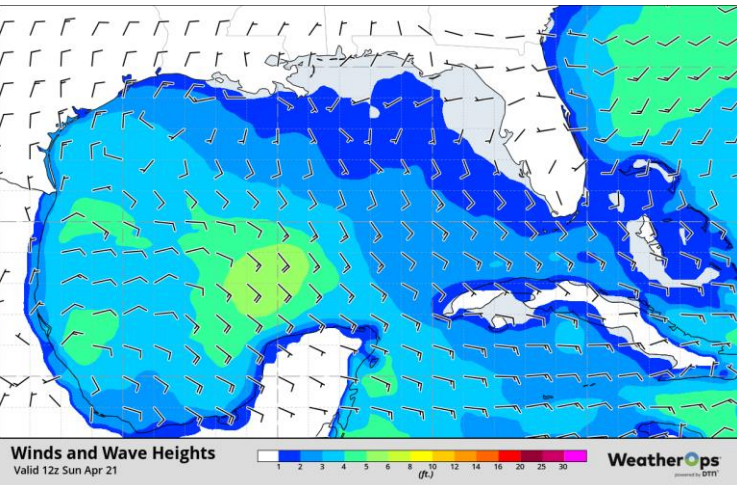

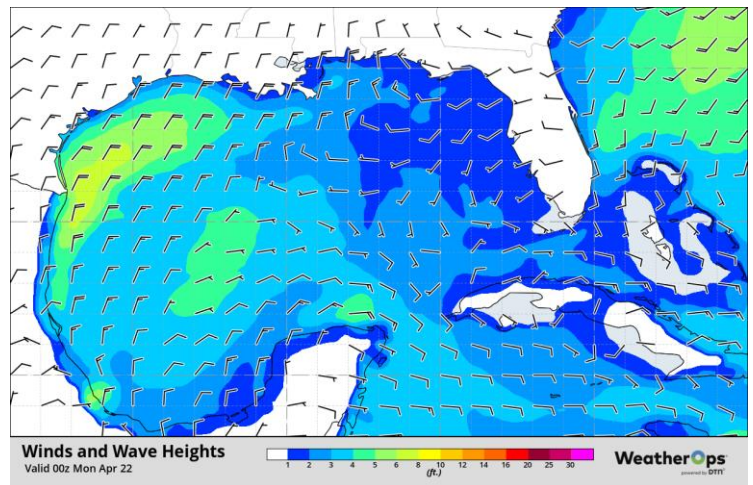

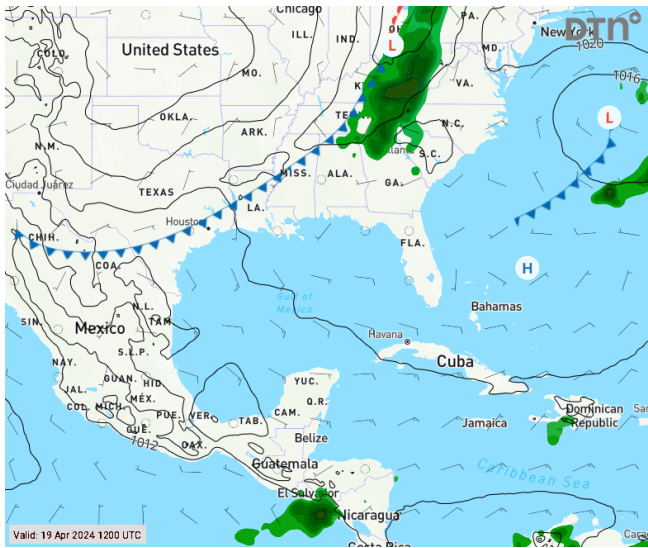


## Day 3 Evening Wind and Seas

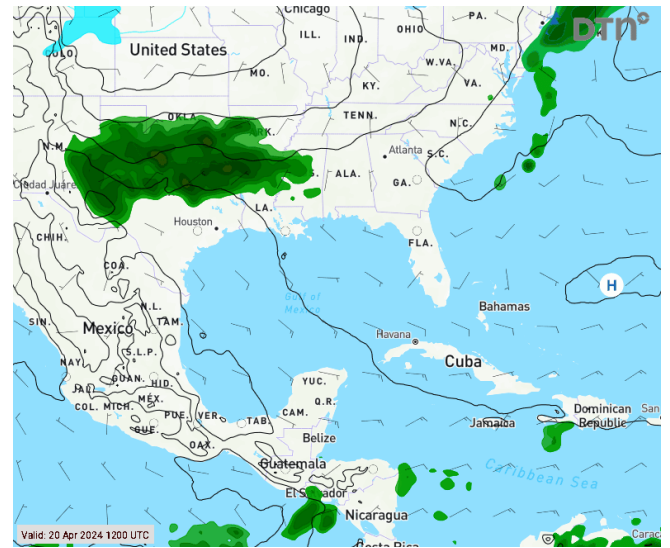




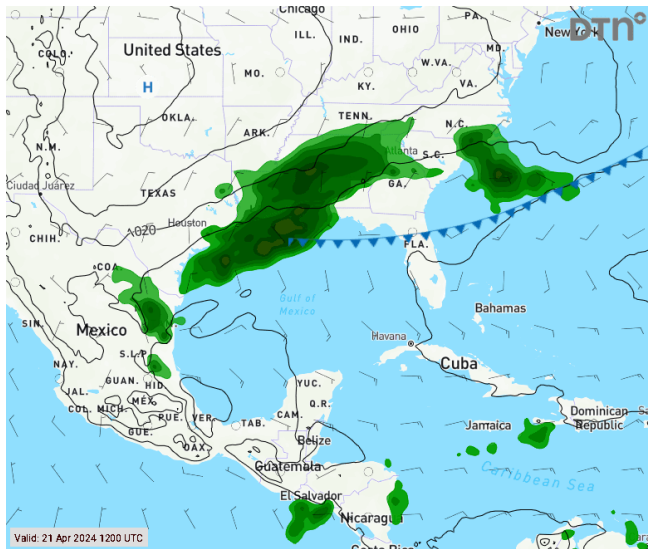
## Day 1 Surface Chart



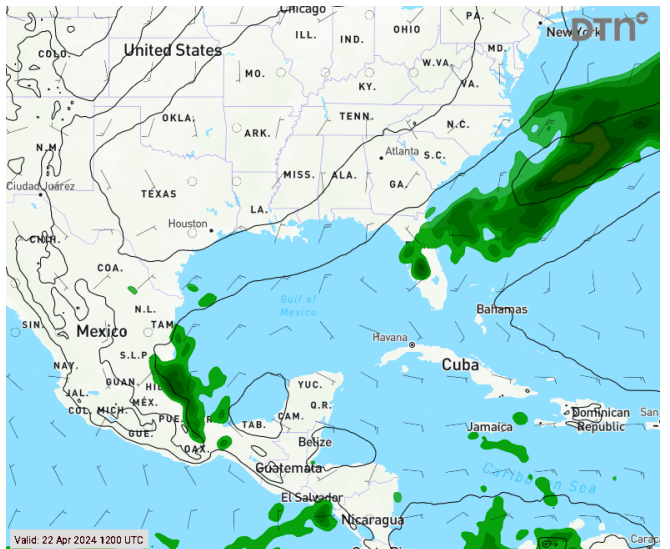

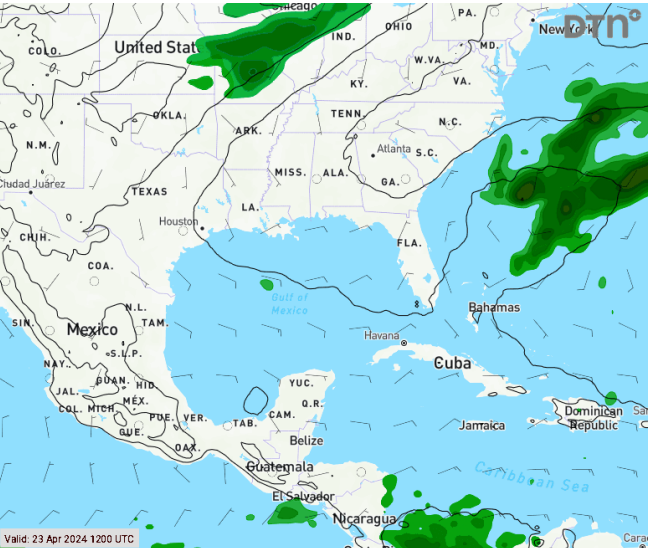
